

M - Medications
P - Problems
L - Last in's and outs
C - Quality
R - Radiates
S - Severity
T - Time

<u>NEXUS</u>

- 1. No C-spine or neck pain
- 2. Must be sober
- 3. Must be A&O x4
- 4. No neurological deficits
- 5. No distracting injuries

Splinting Guideline

- 1. Rigid to support injury
- 2. Immobilizes joints/bones on either side of the injury
- 3. Padded for protection
- 4. Adjustable for comfort
- 5. Accessible for CMS assessment



The Patient Assessment System



Step 1: Safety and Complicating Factors

Scene Size Up

S: Safety

T: Terrain

E: Environment

R: Resources

1: Impression of the patient and of the situation

Step 2: Find and Fix Life Threats

Primary Assessment

A: Airway

B: Breathing

C: Circulation (blood sweep) stop bleeds first

D: Disability (of the brain, spinal cord, nerves) (LOC/CMS)

E: Environment (hypowrap or cool down)



Step 3: Gather Information

Secondary Assessment

Vitals Head to Toe Exam WFR Level of Consciousness Blood Pressure (LOC) (BP) Pulse (HR) Pupils (PERRL) Respiratory Rate (RR) O₂ Saturation Skin Glucose **Medical History** S: Signs/Symptoms O: Onset P: Palliate/Provoke A: Allergies M: Medications **Q**: Quality R: Refer **P**: Pertinent Medical History **✓** CSMs **S**: Severity (1-10) L: Last Ins/Outs T: Time E: Event



Step 4: Management and Reassess

Provide treatments if not done already. Recheck ABCDE's.
